Hello and welcome to the Canadian Nuclear Laboratories Virtual Open House on Decommissioning Douglas Point. My name is Julie Therrien and I am the Manager of Operations for Douglas Point.

Canadian Nuclear Laboratories is planning to complete final decommissioning for the Douglas Point prototype reactor and facility. Decommissioning will will help minimize and consolidate Canada's nuclear waste liabilities and reduce risk. Over the next ten years we will work in phases to safely remove structures and associated material, ensuring people and the environment remain protected throughout the process. Essentially, it's an environmental remediation project.

In order to take the next steps in decommissioning we are asking for a licence amendment from Canada's nuclear regulator, the Canadian Nuclear Safety Commission. The hearing on our licence amendment application will be November 25 and 26. A licence amendment is necessary to start final decommissioning but not sufficient. There are additional regulatory decisions throughout the project.

Right now, we are listening and hearing from the public and Indigenous communities. We want to hear your thoughts on the project so we can incorporate your interests and concerns into our long-term decommissioning plans.
